### The Harry Potter Studio Tour

Hands up who hasn't heard of Harry Potter! I can't believe there is anyone who hasn't heard of him. Just in case you haven't - he is a fictional boy wizard created by British author J.K. Rowling. For those Harry Potter fans that have read the books and seen the movies I have some good news. Now you can visit the Harry Potter movie set where many of the scenes were shot. You can do this by visiting the Leavesden Studios near Watford, Hertfordshire, in the UK, where all eight films were made over the course of a decade. The *Harry Potter Studio Tour* offers fans the opportunity to see behind-the-scenes look at how the films were made. Visitors will be able to see the sets, props and costumes that appeared in the movies. You can wander down the cobbles of Diagon Alley, inspect the table settings in the Great Hall at Hogwarts, gaze at the bookshelves in Dumbledore's office and peer through the windows of number four Privet Drive. Other things to see include Hermione's cloak, Harry's broomstick and Hagrid's motorcycle.

The highlight of the tour is seeing the model of Hogwarts. Built to 1:24 scale, it was used in the exterior shots for the first six films. The attention to detail is incredible; with 3,000 fibre-optic lights fitted inside and turned on as the night sky darkens. Some of the wonderful creatures J.K. Rowling dreamt up are also on display including Dobby the House Elf. Videos explain how the films were made, like the Quidditch stunts. Some people might think however that the ticket prices are expensive. The prices are £21 for a child ages 5-15, £28 for an adult, £83 for a family of four. The prices are comparable to the likes of Alton Towers. You'll need three hours to enjoy the Harry Potter moment. Visitors can stop off at the gift shop. This could leave you seriously out of pocket as there are mountains of Potter merchandise for you to buy.

Unfortunately, there's no chance of perching on Harry's dorm room bed or settling down in Hagrid's hut as rooms are cordoned off behind ropes. But you will be able to sit astride a broomstick as the streets of London fly past you via the green screen room. Warner Bros are expecting 5,000 people a day to come through the doors.

## EXERCISES

**8. Let's roleplay 1: BBC Radio 5:** In pairs/groups. One of you is the interviewer. The others are one of the following people. You are in the *BBC Radio 5* radio studio in London. Today's interview is about: *The Harry Potter Studio Tour. 10 minutes*.
