## Crystal Palace to be rebuilt

Crystal Palace in London is to be rebuilt. Plans and images have been unveiled that show how Crystal Palace will look when it is rebuilt as a modern day cultural attraction.

The original Crystal Palace was destroyed by fire in 1936. The massive iron and glass structure was originally erected in Hyde Park, London, to house the Great Exhibition of 1851. More than 14,000 exhibitors from around the world gathered to see the latest technology.

Crystal Palace was designed by Sir Joseph Paxton. It was 1,851ft long, with an interior height of 128ft. In 1854 Crystal Palace was rebuilt in an enlarged form on Penge Common, next to Sydenham Hill, which was an affluent south-east London suburb full of large villas.

In 1866 a fire caused damage to the north transept. In 1871 the world's first cat show was held at Crystal Palace. By the 1890s the popularity of Crystal Palace began to wane and the building was beginning to deteriorate.

Fast forward to the 30<sup>th</sup> November 1936 and the building was destroyed by fire. The flames could be seen in eight counties. 100,000 people came to Sydenham Hill to watch the blaze including Winston Churchill.

Recently in 2013 a Chinese developer unveiled plans to rebuild the iconic Crystal Palace. Chinese billionaire Ni Zhaoxing is bankrolling the £500million project. It will be rebuilt to 'the same size and scale' as the original.

The surrounding public park is also to be restored 'to its former glory through landscaping, planting and new and improved facilities for the public' a spokesperson said. Work is scheduled to start in 2015.
