Recently the world was shocked with the news that Pope Benedict XVI had resigned. The news that the Head of the Catholic Church was to step down at the end of February shocked world political leaders, as well as religious figures.

The Pope said he is too old to continue, citing ill health. He is 85, has arthritis and has been wearing a pacemaker for many years. It is the first time in nearly 600 years that a Pope has resigned. Most normally die of old age while in office.

The Pope's decision may lead to a much younger Pope being elected. The question is - will it be an Italian or other European or someone from Africa, the America's or indeed Asia? Whoever it is, The Vatican expects a new Pope to be elected before Easter.

Cardinal Joseph Ratzinger became Pope in 2005 following the death of Pope John Paul II. He took the helm aged 78, making him one of the oldest Popes elected. His resignation is the first since 1415, when Pope Gregory XII handed in his notice amid a schism within the church.

The Pope's closest aides said the move showed "great courage" and "determination". The new Pope will be elected by members of a 117-strong nominating conclave in the Sistine Chapel at the Vatican.

The Pope's decision to quit highlights the fact that the Vatican should consider a much younger man for the job. If you think about it most people retire around the age of 65. The current Pope was elected at 78! Whoever is elected takes on the modern world, with all the pressures it brings. A much younger Pope makes sense, surely?
